

- Clean and dry a mason jar, remove the lid and place on a flat surface.
- Dampen the potting medium of your plant and then remove its pot or cell, making sure not to pull it out by the top.
- Squeeze the root ball and then place the plant in the lid of the jar. You want the root ball to be compact and if possible, have all the roots covered with soil.
- To give the terrarium a finished look, take small pieces of moss and press them on to the soil around the plant, creating a nice green mound.
- Carefully corral the leaves and branches of your plant so they will fit into the jar, being careful to push the leaves and branches up. Gently place the bottle over the plant, using your fingers to push the greenery into the jar.
- Keep it out of direct sunlight, but try to give it bright indirect light. You may not have to water it for months, though you should check to make sure the soil is

moist, not wet every couple of weeks.
